



## **Woodlands Operations Consultant RFQ 7000016384**

Work will consist of a variety of remote forestry work as directed by Alberta-Pacific Forest Industries Inc. (Al-Pac) representative. The position will require two-way communication with Woodlands staff and Contractors (*e.g.*, loggers, haul, reclaim) to achieve safety, production, cost and compliance targets. Communication is a key element in getting the work done to meet all safety, governmental, and organizational standards, maintain positive relationships with Contractors and Indigenous communities, as well as production targets.

### **Overview of Role Responsibilities**

- Project Field Supervision, risk and issue management: Consulting logging, hauling, road construction, road maintenance, reclamation activities and focus on operational efficiencies.
- Inspections: Providing technical support to perform quality inspections for harvesting production, road and drainage structures, log quality and reclamation in accordance with regulatory requirements and organizational standards.
- Indigenous community and Contractor engagement: work with Coordinators to ensure operations is performed with the intention to support and strengthen Al-Pac's relationships with communities and local contractors.
- Cost Management: maintaining cost expectations while supporting safety, quality, production, and environmental objectives.
- Technical Support: supporting Operations Coordinator and Contractors with technical duties to ensure operations are performed with the following in mind: safety, environmental compliance, production and cost effectiveness.

**Working conditions**

- Overnight stays are required at fully serviced camps or hotels, depending on where operations are active within the FMA
- Work will be completed year-round during various weather conditions
- Variable work schedules including work shifts and seasonal work.

Term is 1 July 2025 to 31 December 2025 with a possibility of an extension based on performance. The shortlisted candidates will be scheduled for an interview with a panel comprised of Al-Pac Team Members.
