Qualifications for this role include:

- A Registered Professional Forester (RPF) or be eligible for registration as an RPF with the Association of BC Forest Professionals and two years of experience in operational field forestry activities.
- Operational field forestry activities include the following:
 - Timber harvesting monitoring/conformance
 - Cut-block development
 - Forest road engineering
 - Silviculture
 - Timber tenure development and administration
 - Planning integrated resource management
- Must possess at minimum a valid Class 5 B.C. Driver's License that does not limit or restrict the ability to conduct the duties of the job.
