- Plants/transplants trees by both mechanical and hand methods.
- Prunes and removes trees (not required to work at heights).
- Assists those working at heights in the handling of ropes or acting as a spotter, including work performed in proximity to energized conductors.
- Drives/operates/inspects and ensures proper maintenance of various equipment including dump truck, aerial tower (from base), 8-ton crane, trailered hydro vacuum excavator, chipper, stumper, tractor/loader, chain saw, concrete saw, sawzall, motorized pole saw and other associated equipment and hand tools.
- Handles/loads/chips brush and wood.
- Performs tree pit/container maintenance.
- Updates skills as required to meet trade standards and operational requirements.
