- has experience operating 4x4 vehicles, trailers, snowmobiles, and all-terrain vehicles;
- has a valid First Aid certificate (Basic, with Transportation Endorsement);
- completion of a post-secondary diploma or degree program in forestry or a related field (preferred); and
- current registration as a practicing forest professional (RPF/RFT) with the FPBC (preferred).

Timber Cruiser – Kamloops

Position Description

We have an immediate opening for an experienced timber cruiser, based out of our Kamloops office.

Timber cruisers work within a highly integrated, professional team to provide field-based expertise in timber valuation. The position listed requires mainly fieldwork, but effective office work skills are also necessary. While we strive to keep you at home as much as possible, some hotel based camp work is inherent to these positions.

Qualifications

In addition to the basic qualifications, the successful applicant will meet or exceed the following:

- is an Accredited Timber Cruiser (ATC), Accredited Timber Evaluator (ATE) with Forest Professionals British Columbia (FPBC);
- has 3+ years of interior timber cruising experience in British Columbia;
- has experience in cruise plan preparation and cruise compilation (preferred)
- has other forestry experience such as timber development, waste and residue surveys or silviculture surveys (preferred);
- basic skills working within a Microsoft 365 environment (Outlook, Teams, Word, Excel, OneDrive, SharePoint);

Compensation

Depending on the level of experience, autonomy, supervisory, and leadership capacity the candidate brings to the role, the open position can be filled at a variety of levels. The projected wage range is from \$28 to \$38 per hour¹. Additionally, we offer benefits along with an opportunity for permanent full-time positions.

Junior and Senior Timber Development Technicians – Kamloops

Position Description

We have immediate openings for junior to senior timber development technicians, based out of our Kamloops office.

Timber development staff work within a highly integrated, professional team to provide field-based expertise in cutblock and road layout. The position listed requires mainly fieldwork, but effective office work skills are also necessary. While we strive to keep you at home as much as possible, some hotel based camp work is inherent to these positions.

Example duties:

- cutblock layout;
- road layout;
- reconnaissance surveys;
- riparian classification and assessments;
- timber appraisal data collection; and
- wildlife tree retention area identification.

Qualifications

In addition to the basic qualifications, the successful applicant will meet or exceed the following:

Senior Development Technician:

- has 5+ years of timber development experience in British Columbia;
- has other forestry experience such as timber cruising, waste and residue surveys or silviculture surveys (preferred)
- basic skills working within a Microsoft 365 environment (Outlook, Teams, Word, Excel, OneDrive, SharePoint);

Junior Development Technician:

- has 1+ field season(s) or co-op work semester of timber development experience in British Columbia;
- has other forestry experience such as timber cruising, waste and residue surveys or silviculture surveys (preferred)
- basic skills working within a Microsoft 365 environment (Outlook, Teams, Word, Excel, OneDrive, SharePoint);

Compensation

Depending on the level of experience, autonomy, supervisory, and leadership capacity the candidate brings to the role, the open position can be filled at a variety of levels. The projected wage range is from \$22 to \$28 per hour² for junior technicians and \$28 to \$35 per hour³ for senior technicians. Additionally, we offer benefits along with an opportunity for permanent full-time positions.

Forestry Manager (RPF/RFT) – Kamloops

Position Description

We are seeking an experienced forest professional (Registered Professional Forester or Registered Forest Technologist) capable of working with limited supervision and who can manage projects from start to finish. Directing and supervising other staff, the successful candidate should be a self-starter looking to take their career to the next level.

We have numerous ongoing projects related to full-phase timber development, silviculture surveying, timber cruising, waste and residue surveying, woodlot management, and more. We want additional expertise to help us excel as an organization.

The open position is purposefully imprecise. Each forest professional brings a unique set of interests and abilities, so crafting a role to fit a candidate makes more sense than fitting someone into a pre-determined job. Therefore, we encourage those curious about this opportunity to begin a conversation so we may see if there is alignment between our interests and yours. That said, this role is anticipated to be primarily office-based; however, some degree of associated field work skills are expected. Our work is primarily local although occasional remote field work may be necessary.

To be clear, this is not a training role. We want someone who can come in and make an immediate contribution. Naturally, we will support you in adjusting to working with our company, on our projects and with our clients, but we expect you to adapt your skills to fit the role, not develop them from scratch.

- a minimum of approximately 5 years of experience in professional forestry in BC;
- excellent skills working within a Microsoft 365 environment (Outlook, Teams, Word, Excel, OneDrive, SharePoint);
- familiarity with Geographic Information Systems (GIS) applications like ArcGIS;
- familiarity with common forest industry computer applications relevant to your practice area (e.g. RESULTS, LRM, FTA, ECAS etc.)
- a good understanding of forestry legislation and policy within your area of expertise;
- a desire to be a leader in your field;
- the ability and interest to lead and mentor others;

Compensation

The salary range for this position is anticipated to be between \$70,000 and \$90,000 annually, based on a 40-hour work week. Health, dental and other benefits are also offered. The final compensation package is negotiable.
