**The role.** We are seeking a full-time, permanent Land Management Supervisor within our Woodlands Department. Reporting to the Land Management Superintendent, you will be responsible for providing assistance in the development of strategic land management initiatives, participating in research programs and coordinating MPR's land use program.

### Role and Responsibilities:

- Assist in the development of strategic management plans, evaluations and analyses, and the assessment of policies and regulations.
- Champion the development and transfer of innovative tools for sustainable forest management including the implementation of remote sensing and logistical systems for tactical and operational planning and reporting.
- Assist in the implementation and maintenance of MPR's research initiatives and programs (EMEND, Healthy Landscapes Program, Growth and Yield program, etc.).
- Coordinate the day-to-day operation of MPR's land use program including road use, management of dispositions and monitoring of crossings.
- Promote MPR's stewardship, innovations, and collaborative spirit with stakeholders and Indigenous communities through coordination of MPR's Public Advisory Committee meetings, tours and forest stewardship reporting.
- Additional duties, as required.

### Qualifications and Experience

- University degree or diploma in forestry, environmental sciences, or related field.
- Member or eligible to become a member of the Alberta Association of Forest Management Professionals (AAFMP).
- Safety conscious individual who can demonstrate safe work practices with respect to people, equipment, and processes.
- Team player with excellent interpersonal, communication and organizational skills.
- Strong attention to detail with the ability to manage and prioritize projects.
- Comfortable writing technical reports and delivering presentations to a broad array of audiences.
- Proficiency with GIS and GPS utilizing ESRI products will be considered an asset (ArcMap, ArcGIS Pro, ArcGIS Online, Field Maps, etc.)
- Must possess a valid Alberta Class 5 drivers license.
- Able to work in a physically demanding setting, required to work outdoors in varied climates.
- Proficiency using a computer, including Microsoft Office Suite and Google Suite of Applications will be considered an asset.
