The role. We are seeking a full-time, permanent Planning Supervisor within the Woodlands Department. The successful candidate will be responsible for developing operational plans, supporting the team in the delivery of logs to the MPR Mill.

- Act as the Company representative with regulatory agencies, industry stakeholders, public stakeholders.
- Development of the General Development Plan (GDP) and associated Annual Operating Plans (AOP).
- Preparation and submission of operational plans that comply with government regulations.
- Work with other forestry companies on integrated plans.
- Management of layout staff and contractors.
- Supervise and coordinate with a variety of forestry contractors.
- Conduct field inspections, audits and assessments.
- Monitoring of harvesting operations, including direct supervision of logging contractors during active operations.
- Environmental Management System, Quality and Health & Safety programs.
- Liaise with Government officials on various approvals.
- Development of annual budgets, including monitoring of annual expenditures.
- Variety of projects throughout the year.
- Mix of field and office work.
- Additional duties, as required.

Qualifications and Experience

- University degree or diploma in forestry, environmental sciences, or related field.
- Member or eligible to become a member of the Alberta Association of Forest Management Professionals (AAFMP).
